THE NEW MOSQUE





مسجد جدید





"PALESTINIAN CULTURE EVENT"

This event was hosted at JMU on 11/15/2024 by Students for Justice in Palestine, to educate the students about the Palestinian culture and to share a meal prepared by the Muslim community. A few people volunteered to speak about culture in Palestine. Muawia Dames read some chapters from "Living Through The Nakba: Tales of a Palestinian Youth" by Nina Bazouzi Cullers who is a Palestinian woman. recalling her life under the Israeli occupation. Three Palestinian sisters, daughters of Zaher Zuhour, talked about the Palestinian culture. Ayah Zuhour spoke about the resilience and the deep roots of the culture and the fight against Israel stealing major factors from the culture. Dima Zuhour talked about the mass destruction in Gaza and the heritage sites in Palestine. Finally, Sara Zuhour talked about the deep meaning of the olive tree, and its connection to the land land ancestors. After each speech the audience were allowed to discuss what had been said, to get a good understanding of what's happening. The event concluded with Palestinian songs and people the Palestinian dancing dabke. uniting everyone beautifully.

"PALESTINE AND ME"

This event was hosted by the SJP (Students Fall Justice in Palestine) by JMU students on11/12/2024. This event welcomed four faculty members to talk about Palestine's history and their stories and experiences, to present to a crowd of over 60 people of students and community members. Professor Israa Alhassani talked about what happened in Palestine between 1900-1948, under the British Mandate. Dr. Tim Seidel spoke on the Nakba which happened in 1948 the day millions of Palestinians lives changed and the recent history of the conflict. Dr. Robert Bersson talked about his story of experiencing his personal journey to Palestine. Finally, Dr. Hasan Hamdan shared his family's experiences and history under the occupation. Once the stories were shared, the event concluded with two JMU students joining the panel to answer and discuss questions from the audience.


